Will/ going to

- We both will & going to for the future.
- We use Going To for the future, especially for arrangements.
- We use WILL for the future too, especially for something we have just decided about.



Examples

- She is going to watch the TV this evening.
- I am going to buy some books tomorrow.
- She is going to sell her house.
- They are going to wash the garage.
- He is going to repair my car tonight.



Will

- We use infinitive after WILL.
- I
- We
- You + will + verb (base).
- She/he/it
- they



Examples

- I will visit them.
- I will call you back again.
- She will tell you later.
- They will appear.
- We will need some salt.

- Will you see the doctor?

- Is she going to buy a car?
- Will she buy a car?
